The TuWezeshe Fellowship is a bespoke leadership development and mentoring program for young African women from Uganda, Kenya, Somali land and the UK working or hoping to work against sexual and gender based violence. Part of the international *TuWezeshe Akina Dada Africa-UK Young Women’s Empowerment Movement*, the one year fellowship offers participants the opportunity to gain core leadership skills, to be mentored by an established woman-leader and to implement their own, funded, project. As part of our commitment to improving the visibility and profile of young African-women leaders, participants will have the chance to shape sexual and gender-based violence policy, network with other inspiring young women leaders across East Africa and the UK and share their ideas, voices and stories on a range of national and international platforms. Successful applicants must be willing to participate in all aspects of the fellowship and be prepared to commit a minimum of 6 months and a maximum of two-years to the fellowship.
